Imperialism always thrives on dividing nations, countries and people of common ancestry. There is no way Africa shall enjoy meaningful independence, if we do not strive to

change the mindset of all the masses of Africa, from being beggars, users of other peoples' items and technology to be a proud people putting forward a desire to be self-reliant and working for complete integration of Africa either into viable economic blocs or a one powerful united Africa

This way Africa's capability to defend herself shall be enhanced thus guaranteeing her independence and rapid socio-economic transformation.

In this endeavor let us remember that it is not going to be an easy path, but rather must be ready to carry out a long march like an arduous journey, that has been demonstrated by the DPRK, the land of Juche and Songun.

We must adopt an ideological path that takes into account the concrete realities, while borrowing the lessons from the Juche philosophy that has been preserved through Songun policies.

We should stand encouraged by the resilience of the DPRK, today standing up against imperialist aggression. Africa therefore should realize that independence is only possible when you are strong. Strength is a factor of unity and believing in determining one's destiny.
